### **School of the Holy Spirit**

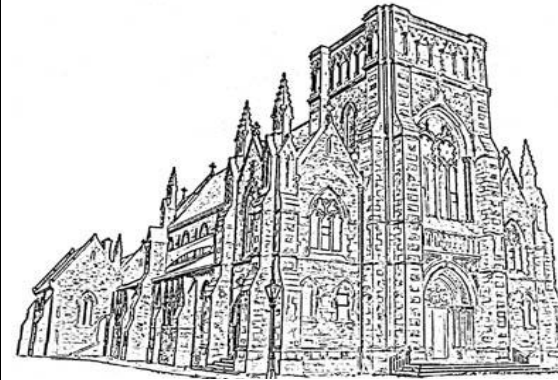
