

## The Prodigal Son

Today we reflect on our belief that Jesus is the chosen one of God, he is the anointed one, he is the Christ. He is the one who gives sight to our blindness, the one who restores our health, the one who reconciles us to the Father.

Today, because it is the Fourth Sunday of Lent, is also Mothers' Day when we give thanks to God for our mothers, we make a special fuss of them, and think of how much we owe to them for their care and love.

So let us think of all of God's blessings to us: for giving us loving mothers, for giving us his love and forgiveness, and for sending us Jesus the Christ.

This Sunday is traditionally known as 'Laetare Sunday' from the opening word of the introit: Laetare Ierusalem ... (Be joyful O Jerusalem ...) which has been retained as the entrance antiphon in the current Missal.

The parable of the prodigal son, as today's Gospel is commonly known, is probably the most inaccurately titled story in all of literature. Jesus' tale tells us less about the boy's sin than about the abundant mercy of his father who forgives his son and joyfully welcomes him home even before the son can bring himself to ask. The father's joy stands in sharp contrast to the prodigal son's brother, who cannot even bring himself to call the prodigal his "brother" – in confronting his father, he angrily refers to the brother as "this son of yours." This parable of forgiveness and reconciliation reveals a God of such great love that he cannot bear the loss of a single child. Jesus holds up the father as the model of the love and forgiveness of God the Father that we should seek in all relationships.

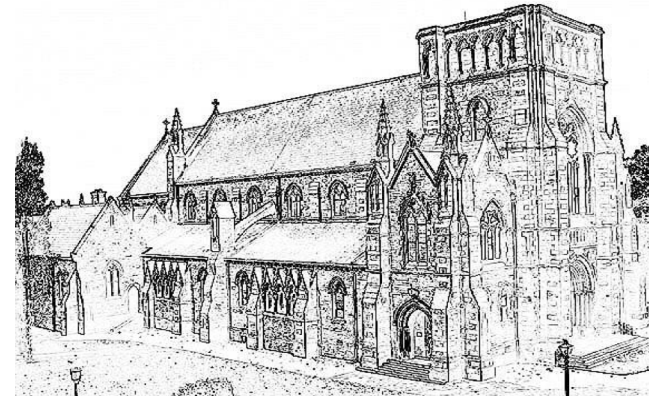
