The Universal Synod



In preparation for the Universal Synod of the Church to be held in Rome in October a group of theologians (lay men and women, bishops, priests, and consecrated men and women) have worked on 107 reports from Bishops' Conferences around the world, including Ireland's. They also worked with contributions from religious, university faculties, associations and individuals from around the world. The reports are the fruit of the work that local

churches did since the Synthesis Report of the first session of the 16th Assembly last October. Among the themes most frequently mentioned in the reports are formation for synodality, the functioning of participatory bodies, the role of women, young people, attention to the poor, inculturation, transparency and a culture of accountability on the part of those who assume ministry in the Church, but also catechesis and Christian initiation, collaboration among churches, the figure of the bishop, etc. According to Cardinal Grech, Secretary General of the Synod, each document was carefully read with the aim that at the end of the gathering, the group would present a text that reflected "the work, questions and insights received from the grassroots."

Over the next few weeks this body of work will be further studied and distilled and a working document (*Instrumentum Laboris*) will be prepared for the Synod this autumn.

message of both letter and video asserts that every person possesses inherent, infinite dignity that remains intact regardless of their circumstances. In this context, the bishops strongly oppose the Oireachtas Committee's proposal to Government to legislate for assisted suicide and call on support for healthcare workers who uphold the sanctity of life.

Peter's Pence Collection

The Peter's Pence collection will be taken up worldwide this weekend. This is an opportunity for communities around the world to support the Pope's work – a mission of peace, charity, and solidarity with those in need. By donating to the second collection at Mass this weekend we can actively contribute to the universal mission of Pope Francis. This mission is more necessary than ever in a world troubled by wars, the arms race, injustices, the suffering of many poor people, and attacks on the sanctity of human life and personal dignity. The message of the Successor of Peter is universal and rooted in the Gospel. In order to reach everyone, it needs the support of each of us. Peter's Pence is a donation that can be small in amount, but which holds great symbolic value.

Points to Ponder

To have access to his heart, to Jesus' heart, there is only one requirement: to feel in need of healing and to entrust yourself to him. I ask you: do each of you feel that you need to be healed? Of something, of some sin, of some problem? And, if you feel this, do you have faith in Jesus? These are the two requirements in order to be healed, in order to have access to his heart: to feel in need of healing and to entrust yourself to Him.

In this Gospel passage the themes of faith and of new life, which Jesus came to offer to all, are intertwined. When he enters the house where the dead girl lies, he sends outside those who are weeping and making tumult (cf. v. 40), and he says: 'The child is not dead but sleeping' (v. 39). Jesus is Lord, and before him physical death is like a dream; there is no reason to despair. Another death is the one to fear: that of the heart hardened by evil! When we feel we have a hardened heart, a heart that is hardened, allow me to say, a mummified heart, we should be afraid of this. But sin too, the mummified heart too, is never the last word with Jesus, because he has brought us the infinite mercy of the Father. It is beautiful to hear that word of Jesus addressed to each one of us: 'I say to you, arise! Go. Stand up. Take courage, arise!'. Jesus restores life to the little girl and restores life to the healed woman: life and faith to both.
