# Prayer to Mary Magdalene – Feast Day on Monday, 22<sup>nd</sup> July

Pope Benedict XVI referred to Mary Magdalene as "a disciple of the Lord who plays a lead role in the Gospels." The Pope recalled Mary Magdalene's presence "beneath the Cross" on Good Friday, as well as how "she was to be the one to discover the empty tomb" on Easter morning. "The story of Mary of Magdala reminds us all of a fundamental truth," Pope Benedict said. "A disciple of Christ is one who, in the experience of human weakness, has had the humility to ask for his help, has been healed by him and has set out following closely after him, becoming a witness of the power of his merciful love that is stronger than sin and death."
