Jubilee Year 2025 – Pilgrims of Hope

Pope Francis has declared 2025 a Jubilee Year, entitled *Pilgrims of Hope*. The Pope urges nations to grant amnesty to prisoners and calls on the world's most powerful entities to forgive the debts of poor countries during the Holy Year.

The Holy Door - The beginning of the Jubilee Year is marked by the opening of one of the usually sealed entrances that lead into the major basilicas of Rome: this entrance is called the Holy Door. On Christmas Eve 2024 Pope Francis will formally announce the beginning of the Holy Year as he opens the Holy Door at the entrance to St Peter's Basilica.

2024 - A Year of Prayer - In preparation for the 2025 Jubilee Year, Pilgrims of Hope, 2024 has been designated a Year of Prayer by Pope Francis. He asks us all to join in a great "symphony of prayer", "to renew our desire to be in the presence of the Lord, to listen to him and to adore him".

What do Catholics do during a Jubilee Year? - The Jubilee Year is an opportunity to respond to God's call to turn to him and to pursue justice. In the Jubilee Year of 2000 many Christians joined together to call for cancellation of debt owed by the world's poorest countries.

Often people will go on pilgrimage during a Jubilee year, to Rome or another holy site. Pope Francis writes:

"Pilgrimage is of course a fundamental element of every Jubilee event. Setting out on a journey is traditionally associated with our human quest for meaning in life. A pilgrimage on foot is a great aid for rediscovering the value of silence, effort and simplicity of life."

Where Does Prayer Begin?

Surely by asking. "Ask and you shall receive." Jesus encouraged us to begin there. It is what everyone instinctively understands prayer to be: asking, interceding, beseeching God for things we want. The Old and New Testaments are full of instruction to do this. The psalms, for instance, give many examples of how to pray this prayer, because we never outgrow the needs which give rise to it. We never cease to depend on God for everything, however mystical our prayer may later become. If you have no faith, praying to God to give you things is senseless. But with faith, it is eminently sensible.
