Mass Paths and Holy Wells Survey

Kilkenny County Council, in partnership with Shanarc Archaeology and Wicklow Willow, are conducting a survey of holy wells and Mass paths in County Kilkenny. Holy wells have been visited for centuries around the county to provide cures, comfort and community. This survey seeks to record what remains in the landscape and in memory so that future generations will understand their importance in our spiritual, social and cultural heritage.

Mass paths are an important and under-recorded part of our cultural heritage. They serve as reminders of the challenges faced by Catholics during penal times, and also reminders of a later era when they were used by people of the area as pedestrian routes to Mass, to visit neighbours and for going to school. If they are not recorded in the near future, their presence and value will have faded from the public memory.

Much of the knowledge of holy wells and Mass paths rests in community memory and Kilkenny County Council needs your help to record this knowledge before it is too late. St. John's Parish Pilgrimage to Knock

The story begins on 21st August 1879, when 15 people from the village of Knock witnessed an apparition of Mary on the gable wall of the parish church. They said she appeared with St. Joseph, St. John the Evangelist, a Lamb and a Cross. They watched in pouring rain for two hours, reciting the Rosary. The watchers were soaked in rain but the gable wall and the apparition remained dry. The witnesses, aged between 5 and 74, gave their testimony to a Commission of Enquiry later in 1879. It found their words "trustworthy and satisfactory". In 1936. a second Commission of Enquiry heard from the two surviving witnesses, Mary O'Connell and Patrick Byrne. Mary O'Connell ended her sworn statement with the words: "I am clear about everything I have said and I make this statement knowing I am going before my God." She died later that year.

Since the Apparition on 21st August 1879, pilgrims and visitors have been welcomed to Knock Shrine from all four corners of the world. The Shrine offers a peaceful, contemplative space in which to pray, to reflect and to reconnect. Among those who have visited are St. Pope John Paul II, St. Teresa of Calcutta and Pope Francis. In March 2019 Pope Francis elevated Knock Shrine to the status of International Eucharistic and Marian Shrine.

On Wednesday of this week about 75 people from our area will travel to Knock with the St. John's Parish Pilgrimage. Buses will leave from St. John's Church at 7.00am sharp returning at about 10.00pm. Pilgrims will break the journey enroute for optional breakfast and dinner some may prefer to bring their own provisions. Please God we will have a safe and refreshing journey - "One thing that is guaranteed is that you will leave Knock Shrine feeling refreshed and renewed. There are no strangers here, only fellow pilgrims ... " (Knock Shrine Website)

Points to Ponder

There was once a king who engaged a street artist to make a painting of the Last Supper. He wanted a picture of Jesus and his friends at their farewell meal for his banqueting room. The artist had Jesus and his friends around the supper table, but he also included all kinds of people around the table, showing people from many races. There were sick, lame and crippled; men and women; young and old; beggars and misfits and some not very nice people. When the King saw the painting he went into a rage, 'Of what is this a painting?' The artist said 'Your Highness, this is a painting of God who delights in all people; all saints and all sorts are welcomed to the Kingdom and the earthly banquet...and that is my understanding of the Last Supper, Holy Communion and Eucharist.' What we receive in the small piece of bread or the sip of wine at the Eucharist is the gift of life from Jesus. It is the gift of God who has become one of us. It is the gift of love with sacrifice. If we have put self out for others in big or small ways or have cried for another's woes or laughed for another's joy, or held a hand in sympathy or just listened when there were no answers, we know the quality of this gift. In the Eucharist God is close in his creation, In Jesus we can recognise God near at hand. Pope Benedict writes - 'we have to rediscover God, not just any God, but the God that has a human face, because when we see Jesus Christ, we see God'. (www.sacredspace.com)
