Calling all Killians, Kilians, Cillians...

This October an historic pilgrimage will involve the visit of Saint Kilian's relics, along with those of his martyred colleagues, Saints Totnan and Kolonat to Ireland from their resting place in the Altar of Würzburg Cathedral in Germany. The relics inlaid with precious stones are contained in a specially preserved glass case and it will be the first time that they will have left Germany.

St Patrick's College Maynooth has been chosen as a stopping point on the journey, with the relics open to the public for veneration in the College Chapel following Vespers at 6.30pm on Wednesday, 2nd October. The College has issued a special invitation to all who share the Saint's name and are putting a call out to all Kilians, Killians or Cillians to come and join the special evening on 2nd October.

The Spiritual Fruits of Medjugorje

For the last 40 years or so Medjugorje has been a place of pilgrimage and devotion for countless pilgrims, including many from Ireland and Kilkenny who travel there each year to draw closer to God and be spiritually renewed.

On Thursday last, a press conference was held at the Vatican led by Cardinal Víctor Manuel Fernández, Prefect of the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, with the assent of Pope Francis, at which was granted approval (*Nulla Osta*) for devotion linked to Medjugorje, recognizing the abundant spiritual fruits received at the Sanctuary of the Queen of Peace without making a declaration on the supernatural character of the Marian apparitions.

"The time has come to conclude a long and complex history that has surrounded the spiritual phenomena of Medjugorje. It is a history in which bishops, theologians, commissions, and analysts have expressed a series of divergent opinions."

Pope Francis approved the Note on 28th August. It recognizes the goodness of the spiritual fruits linked to Medjugorje, authorizing the faithful to adhere to it – according to the new norms for discerning these phenomena – since "many positive fruits have been noted in the midst of a spiritual experience, while negative and dangerous effects have not spread among the People of God."

The overall judgment of the messages is generally positive, though several clarifications are offered regarding certain expressions. "It is important to clarify from the outset that the conclusions of this Note do not imply a judgment about the moral life of the alleged visionaries," and, in any case, the spiritual gifts "do not necessarily require those involved to have moral perfection."
