World Mission Sunday is the Holy Father's annual appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of overseas mission and missionaries can continue. It always falls on the second last Sunday in October, and like the Good Friday collection for the Holy Land and Peter's Pence, it is one of three yearly universal Church collections.



World Mission Sunday collections take place in every single parish where the Church is present. This includes not only Ireland and Europe, but also in poorer parishes in developing countries. It is a moment of universal solidarity when each member of the Church family, regardless of location or background, play their part in supporting each other. This is what makes it such a special celebration. All offerings made on behalf of World Mission Sunday become part of the Holy Father's Universal Solidarity Fund. This Fund supports missionary activities in over 1,150 young dioceses, mostly in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. As young dioceses grow, so do their needs. On top of this, they are often found in remote areas devastated by conflict or natural disasters. The Universal Solidarity Fund provides aid so that missionaries can continue to go to these places to share the love of God.

Respect UN Peacekeepers in Lebanon

Following a series of recent incidents in which at least four UN peacekeepers were wounded after coming under fire from the Israeli army, Pope Francis has appealed for the troops to be "respected." The appeal came as the Pope again called for an immediate end of hostilities in the Middle East, urging the parties to "pursue the paths of diplomacy and dialogue to achieve peace". The Pope warned: "War is an illusion. It will never bring peace, it will never bring security. It is a defeat for everyone, especially for those who believe themselves invincible." "I pray for all the victims," he added, "for the displaced, for the hostages - who I hope will be released immediately - and I pray that this great needless suffering, generated by hatred and revenge, will soon come to an end."

The Pope also prayed for an end to the wars in "tormented Ukraine, Myanmar, Sudan, and all other peoples suffering from war and all forms of violence and misery".

What is Synodality?

Synodality, *syn hodos* ("the common way"), is designed to renew, revive and deepen not only relationships within the Church, but how the Church relates with other institutions and groups in society, with other cultures and religions, and with the whole human family.

Synodality is a response to the question of how to overcome the crisis of globalisation, how to transform our world into a world of peace and justice.

Synodality is a way of developing the catholicity – the universality – of Christianity. Catholicity, together with unity, holiness and apos-

tolic character, is not only a "mark" and a gift of the Church but it is a task in its journey through history. This includes ecumenical and interreligious cooperation and also, as Pope Francis has emphasised, our care of the earth.

To embark on the path of synodal renewal requires openness, hospitality and inclusiveness – not a naive and uncritical conformity to the external world, but a receptivity to the dynamics of the Holy Spirit.

The synodal reform of the Church is a long term project; expectations of major institutional changes immediately after the second session of the Synod in October should be tempered.
