#### The Advent Wreath

The Advent wreath is one of the most symbolic traditions for the Season of Advent. With its colourful candles lit on each of the four weeks of Advent, the wreath is a reminder of the hope and joy.

The word Advent is derived from the Latin word "adventus," the word advent means "arrival" or "coming." Advent is a season of expectation, celebration, and hope connected to the birth of Christ.

In 1851, the first mention of an Advent calendar was seen in Elise Averdieck's picture book, and in 1839, the Advent wreath first appeared. The wreath is circular in shape which represents the eternal nature of God - His never-ending love, mercy, and faithfulness. It also symbolizes the unending cycle of seasons and the continuous nature of time.

Made from green branches, which do not lose their leaves in winter, we are reminded of the everlasting life found in Christ. They are a symbol of hope and renewal, pointing to the promise of eternal life through Jesus.

The lighting of the candles is an important tradition during Advent. Each week, an additional candle is lit to symbolize the increasing anticipation and preparation for the arrival of Jesus. The light from the candles represents the light of Christ coming into the world.

## **Never Lose Hope**

In response to Olivia, a grandmother who is upset because her granddaughter has not baptised, Pope Francis points out that one should "never lose hope" when a loved one loses their faith, recalling the example of St. Monica, who prayed for decades for the conversion of her son St. Augustine. The Pope also stresses that "baptism cannot be imposed on parents who do not want it for their children." He therefore urges Oliva to "accompany your children, speak with them, but not insist on baptism". "Gratuitous love is more persuasive than many words," the Pope writes. "Love for God plants seeds of the future, of friendship, of the search for Him."
