# The Presentation of the Lord - 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2025

#### The Presentation of the Lord

It was the ancient Jewish practice to recognise the first-born by an offering to God. For example, in the case of farmers, the first cutting of the harvest was offered to God — the first fruits as a sign that the whole harvest came from God. Likewise, the first spring lamb was offered to God by shepherds. When it came to human babies, naturally they did not offer the baby but a substitute gift, as in today's Gospel. It was a way of saying that all life is from God and it was a measure of their sense of wonder at the very gift of life itself.

So, who is this child? It helps to notice the things that are said about the baby Jesus: he is the Christ (the Messiah) of the Lord; a light to the nations; the glory of Israel; a sign of restoration and redemption. St. Luke portrays all these hopes while Jesus was still a baby, in anticipation of what he would become. In the light of the resurrection, we know just how deeply these hopes were fulfilled in Jesus' ministry and teaching, in his death and resurrection and in the gift of the Spirit. We too can catch the thrilling expectation and joy of Simeon and Anna.

**Candlemas Day** 

Sunday, 2<sup>nd</sup> February is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. It is also known as Candlemas Day. This Feast Day commemorates the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. Candles for use in the church and our homes are blessed to day. This is a solemn time of worship, a time to try to be a 'light in the world'.

#### Feast of St. Blaise

Monday, 3<sup>rd</sup> February is the Feast of St. Blaise. He was bishop of Sebaste and was martyred probably early in the 4<sup>th</sup> century. Devotion to him spread throughout the Church during the Middle Ages. A physician before he became a bishop, he is venerated as patron of those who suffer from diseases of the throat. The priests will bless throats after the 10.30am Mass in St John's Church on Monday.

Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, Bishop, and Martyr, may God deliver you from all ailments of the throat and from every other illness. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

#### **Points to Ponder**

'You are never too old.' I remember this phrase from a good friend (who also was my mother) when I contemplated returning to college at the age of 42 to earn an associate degree in physical therapy. Could I learn again and read a textbook? Could I understand Physics 101? Are you kidding? After all, cookbooks and light novels were the extent of my reading! I graduated with honours, passed the state exam and began a second career at 45! Like I said, 'You are never too old. No excuses!'.

Anna lived her long life serving God. She allowed the Lord to work in her, and this brought her to the recognition of this infant being brought to the Temple for his Presentation to the Lord. It had not been an easy life for her, being a widow all those years. Widows in those days did not have the same stature as those with husbands and families. Simeon and Anna were persistent in prayer. They showed up faithfully each day. We can learn from them that God is always at work in a quiet way in our lives, even when things seem impossible. So don't give up and never think you are too old. God will show you things in your life if you stay close to Him with prayer, and you will recognise Him, just as Simeon and Anna recognised the infant, Jesus.
