The Season of Lent 2025

Pope Francis, in his Lenten message, invites us to enter into Lent:

"This Lent, as we share in the grace of the Jubilee Year, I would like to propose a few reflections on what it means to journey together in hope, and on the summons to conversion that God in his mercy addresses to all of us, as individuals and as a community.

First of all, to journey... all of us are pilgrims in this life.

Second, to journey together. The Church is called to walk together, to be synod, Christians are called to walk at the side of others, and never as lone travellers. The Holy Spirit impels... to walk towards God and our brothers and sisters... It means walking side-by-side, without shoving or stepping on others, without envy or hypocrisy, without letting anyone be left behind or excluded. Let us all walk in the same direction, tending towards the same goal, attentive to one another in love and patience.

Third, let us journey together in hope, for we have been given a promise. May the hope that does not disappoint (cf.Rom5:5), the central message of the Jubilee, be the focus of our Lenten journey towards the victory of Easter. May the Virgin Mary, Mother of Hope, intercede for us and accompany us on our Lenten journey."

Ash Wednesday

Mass will be celebrated on Ash Wednesday at 8am, 10.30am and 7.00pm. Blessed Ashes will be distributed at each Mass and will be available in our churches throughout the day.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. On the day in the readings there is an awareness of our sinfulness, as we pray 'Have mercy on us, O Lord, for we have sinned'. There is also a sense that the time to repent and turn back to the Lord is now.

The gospel puts before us three ways to renew our lives: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. These three strands of Lenten observances are as ancient as Christianity itself. "Fasting is the soul of prayer; mercy is the lifeblood of fasting. If we have not all three together, we have nothing" St Peter Chyrsologus.

Stations of the Cross

We invite you to join with us at St. John's Church at 7.30pm on the Fridays of Lent to contemplate the Stations of the Cross. This forty minute devotion commemorates Christ's last day on earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of his last day, beginning with his condemnation. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day.

St Kieran's Day – 5th March

Next Wednesday is the feast of St Kieran. Kieran is referred to as the 'first born of the saints of Ireland' and often identified as Kieran of Saighir distinguishing him from St Ciarán of Clonmacnoise who is called Kieran the Younger.

Kieran's mother was a native of Cape Clear in Co. Cork. It is understood that he was ordained in Rome and consecrated a bishop by St. Patrick who commissioned him to return to Ireland. Patrick gave him a bell instructing him to establish a monastery when the bell would ring. This turned out to be Saighir Chiaráin, near the village of Clareen about four miles south-east of Birr, Co Offaly.

Kieran is often depicted as a John the Baptist type figure, dressed in the skins of wild animals and with a bell and church. Saighir Chiaráin was the centre of Christianity until the bishop's chair transferred to Aghaboe – the monastic foundation of St Canice – and later the moved to Kilkenny.

St Mary's Cathedral was dedicated in 1858 and though while often referred to as St Mary's it also has Kieran as its secondary patron. It is the Cathedral of St Mary and St Kieran. Kieran is the patron saint of the Diocese of Ossory.
